It is our optimal goal to provide you and your family with the highest quality of dental care, while maintaining a friendly and relaxing environment. In order to keep our standard of care to a level which best serves your dental needs we ask you to please observe the following guidelines:

Payment Policy

Unless prior arrangements have been made, payment is due upon completion of treatment. Please note that some services may be covered by your insurance carrier and that every insurance plan has its own exceptions. It is the patient's responsibility to cover procedures that are not covered by the insurance plan.

Appointment Policy

There are many times our patients require urgent or emergency treatment and therefore require an appointment as soon as possible. When patients give the office advanced notice of their need to reschedule an appointment their time can then be allocated to those patients in urgent need of treatment. This allows the office to best serve the needs of all our patients.

Bearing these special needs in mind, the office requires a minimum of 48 hours notice if an appointment must be changed. If less than 48 hours notice has been given to cancel an appointment, a \$50 deposit will be required to reserve your rescheduled appointment time. This fee will be applied toward your treatment that day and be nonrefundable should you cancel the appointment with less than 48 hours notice. Please note that this fee is not covered by dental insurance and payment is the patient's responsibility.

Informed Consent for Dental Treatment

I understand recommended treatment plans will be explained to me as the doctor finds any areas of concern. I understand that by signing this consent I am in no way obligated to any treatment. I also acknowledge that during treatment it may be necessary to change or add procedures because of conditions found while working on the teeth that were not discovered during examination.

Drug and Medications - Antibiotics, analgesics and other medications can cause allergic reactions such as redness and swelling tissue, pain, itching, vomiting and/or anaphylactic shock.

Crown's, Bridges, Veneers – Risks of a dental crown include but are not limited to the following: Irritation of the nerve (pulp), that can lead to sensitivity to temperature or pressure. Possible root canal treatment. Sore jaw or difficulty opening requiring adjustment of tooth bite. A crown is usually near the gum line, it can lead to gum irritation, infection, or decay and proper home care is essential to helping control these problems. Swallowing the crown during treatment. Reaction to anesthetic that could require medical attention. Rare, temporary or permanent nerve injury from injection. Possible loss of tooth.

Periodontal Disease- Periodontal Disease is a serious condition causing gum and bone inflammation and/or loss and can result in the loss of teeth. Left untreated, periodontal disease can lead to the need of gum surgery, tooth extraction and/or replacement.

Fillings-Care must be exercised while chewing on a tooth with a filling. Occasionally, a more extensive restorative procedure than originally diagnosed may be required due to additional or extensive decays found during a filling procedure. Sensitivity is a common side-effect of newly placed fillings.

I understand that dentistry is not an exact science and that, therefore, reputable practitioners cannot properly guarantee results. I acknowledge that no guarantee or assurance has been made by anyone regarding the dental treatment, which I have requested and authorized.
